Materials

- 400g of DK weight yarn in your desired color (for a 12-month-old)
- 4.00mm (US G/6) crochet hook
- Yarn needle

- Scissors
- Measuring tape
- Buttons or snaps for closure (optional)

Terminology

This pattern uses UK crochet terminology. Here is a quick reference:

- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- dc = double crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- sl st = slip stitch
- round = rnd
- st = stitch
- rep = repeat

Pattern

Foundation:

1. Ch 91
2. Sc in the 2nd ch from the hook and in each ch across. (90 sc)

Body:

1. **Rnds 1-18:** Ch 1, turn. Sc in each sc around. (90 sc)

2. **Rnd 19:** Ch 1, turn. Sc in the next 9 sc, 2 sc in the next sc, sc in the next 78 sc, 2 sc in the next sc, sc in the last 9 sc. (92 sc)
3. **Rnd 20:** Ch 1, turn. Sc in each sc around. (92 sc)
4. Rep Rnds 19-20 for a total of 10 times. (102 sc)

Sleeves:

1. **Sleeves 1 & 2:** Ch 41
2. Sc in the 2nd ch from the hook and in each ch across. (40 sc)
3. **Rnds 1-17:** Ch 1, turn. Sc in each sc around. (40 sc)
4. **Rnd 18:** Ch 1, turn. Sc in the next 9 sc, 2 sc in the next sc, sc in the next 28 sc, 2 sc in the next sc, sc in the last 9 sc. (42 sc)
5. **Rnd 19:** Ch 1, turn. Sc in each sc around. (42 sc)
6. **Rnd 20:** Ch 1, turn. Sc in the next 9 sc, 2 sc in the next sc, sc in the next 28 sc, 2 sc in the next sc, sc in the last 9 sc. (44 sc)

Assembly:

1. Pin the sleeves to the body, matching the seams.
2. Sew the sleeves to the body using a mattress stitch.
3. Fold the bottom edge of the jacket up by 1" and sew it down.
4. Fold the top edge of the jacket down by 1" and sew it down.
5. Sew on buttons or snaps for closure.

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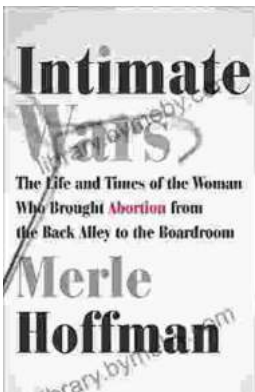
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
